



First Tennessee Park - Nashville Sounds Parking and Transportation for 2015 Season



FREE BALLPARK SHUTTLE: The Metro Courthouse Garage has 800 game day parking spaces available for \$5. Free shuttles from the Metro Courthouse will run approximately every 10 minutes from the courthouse to the central drop-off at 5th and Harrison beginning 90 minutes before game time and will continue to run for 30 minutes after the end of the game. Metro Courthouse Garage is located at 101 James Robertson Parkway. Directions to the garage available at www.parkitdowntown.com/sounds.

FREE DOWNTOWN CIRCULATOR: The Music City Circuit (Blue & Green Circuits) is a free service from Nashville MTA with numerous stops to First Tennessee Park and other locations downtown, including the Gulch. These buses will run approximately every 15 minutes and will continue for 1 hour after the end of the game. For more information, visit www.nashvillemta.org/Nashville-MTA-Music-City-Circuit.asp.

CITY BUSES: Music City Central is the terminus for many of MTA's bus routes. The transit station is just a short walk or ride on the Music City Circuit to the ballpark.

PAID LOTS: Paid parking will be available in private lots around First Tennessee Park. Information regarding these lots may be found at www.parkitdowntown.com/sounds

ADA: All parking lots around the ballpark have ADA accessible spaces. The lot at 5th and Harrison (purple lot) will have additional free parking on a first-come, first-served basis for persons with state issued license plate, placard or decal (please note this lot does not have access aisles).

BIKE SHARE: Nashville BCycle is the city's low-cost bike-sharing program. Hop on a Bcycle and pedal to the ballpark BStation. www.nashville.bcycle.com
